George Edward Davisson, age 93 of Wolcottville, IN and formerly of Rensselaer, passed away August 23, 2010 in Ft. Wayne, Indiana. George was born August 7, 1917 in Rensselaer, the son of Clyde and Myrtle (Barkley) Davisson. He lived in Rensselaer for 70 years before moving to Wolcottville.
