Paul J. Schultz, age 79, of Rensselaer passed away February 26, 2012, at Bass Lake, Indiana. Paul was born in Jasper County, Indiana on October 11, 1932, the son of Herbert Lawrence Schultz and Juanita Pauline (Little) Schultz. He was a 1951 graduate of Fair Oaks High School.

On October 20, 1956, Paul married Mary Ellen Crawford who preceded him in death on July 4, 2005.

He was a veteran of the U.S. Army, serving during the Korean War.

Paul was the equipment manager for over 15 years at St. Joseph College. He owned the Kniman Tavern for 9 years and briefly drove a delivery truck for the former BeerMart. Paul worked alongside his father at the family farm for numerous years.

He was a member of the St. John Lutheran Church where he was past treasurer.

Paul was a member of the Loyal Order of Moose Lodge #2272 since 1972, and held numerous officer positions on both the local and district level. He was awarded the prestigious Pilgrim Degree of Merit on June 4, 2011. He enjoyed gardening and crossword puzzles.

Surviving are three daughters, Mona Loomis and Shannon (Tim) Reisinger, both of Valparaiso, Indiana and Tracy (Jim Cambe) Williams, Bass Lake, Indiana and two grandchildren, Jeremy and Hillary Reisinger.
