



## Ronald Thomas "Ron" Peppin

June 11, 1942 - February 16, 2009

Ronald Thomas "Ron" Peppin, age 66, of Remington passed away February 16, 2009 at the Clarian Arnett Hospital, Lafayette, Indiana after an unexpected illness. He was born June 11, 1942, in Kankakee, Illinois, the son of the late Harold J. and Lucille (Girard) Peppin. Ron graduated with the class of 1961 from Bradely High School.
