June 4, 1944 - October 16, 2023

Bill Craig - lover of children, doting on grandchildren, giver of compassion, gardener of hostas, elder of the church, lay-pastor of wisdom, letter-writer of solidarity, traveler to China, India, Alaska, optimist, philosopher, teacher, perpetrator of shenanigans, comic of dry wit, and proud democrat - made each person he interacted with feel welcome, comfortable, and unique. He had an artist's mind: encyclopedic, insightful, and kind.

William Thomas Craig was born June 4, 1944, in Yonkers, NY to Marjory (Parsons) and William Alexander Craig. His father died on the battlefield in World War II. He grew up with his mother in Cleveland, OH. He earned a bachelor's degree from Bowling Green University, a master's from the University of Oregon, and a PhD from Canbourne University. He worked in admissions at St. Joseph's College and taught philosophy at Governor's State University. He married Karen L. Foxworthy on August 17, 1968. They have lived in Rensselaer, IN for 48 years. He was an active member, elder, and lay pastor of the First Presbyterian Church. He enjoyed summers with his family at Geneva Center and the Presbyterian Church Camp in Saugatuck, MI. His daughter Cara Craig and her husband Robert Peffley live in Chicago, IL. His younger daughter, Anne Tillett and her husband Wade live in Whitewater, WI. Combined, Bill's adored grandchildren include Alvin (and his wife Yuliana), Brianna, Mira, Brittney, and Naelin – as well as one great grandchild, Sienna Rose.

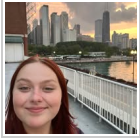
